Brothers Jason and Shane Lamotte, born and raised in Fort Nelson, moved into a small apartment in downtown Edmonton in 2002 with one goal in mind: to get serious about their music careers. What started as just a few guys jamming in a garage in Fort Nelson was beginning to form into something greater. With little money, a couple of guitars, and a whole lot of ambition, the brothers sat in their smoke filled apartment and started to work on their first album. When released it would be a self-titled album called, "Living Illusion."

The brothers' musical education began young. While they were enrolled in Fort Nelson Secondary they were both active



members of the school band. Through this elective they were both able to perform at the national Music Fest Canada. During these formative years they had accessed great, local music teachers, including Dave Whenham and Maureen Wiebe. The boys'

also received wonderful musical direction from Dan Craven and Matt Wallace at FNSS, even if their tastes in music didn't always align.

After releasing their first album, which the brothers produced and engineered themselves, they played numerous live shows and festivals in western Canada. Their biggest personal show was in small town Alberta where they played for over 5,000 people. Along the way they had the opportunity to open for many bands, including Econoline Crush, The Art of Dying, Tin Foil Phoenix, Ninja Spy and Ashes Divide. During this time their first

single "Whispers" made it to the top ten of numerous university and college radio charts receiving airplay in Canada, the UK and the United States.

After a few years of playing live heavily the brothers were ready to record their next album. For a change of pace they chose to work with one of the Edmonton's best rock producers Kevin Hoskin and they headed into Beta Sound Recording Studio to work on their second record. Nearly a year later, they released "Suffering" to an almost sold out show at the Starlite Room in Edmonton. Their first single "Let's Start Over" received mainstream radio airplay in Canada and charted into the Top 100 for Canadian Rock Radio.

The brother's music has since been used by many internet personalities and shows including The Phillip Defranco

Show, That Guy with the Glasses, The Spooky Experiment, Atop the Fourth Wall and Weekend Confirmed. Their YouTube Channel has received over 300,000 video views and they have maintained their website since 2003. The internet has been a big part of their success.

Jason now lives in Nanaimo on Vancouver Island attending University and Shane lives in Edmonton working as an Event Coordinator, but don't assume they have given up on music. The brothers still continue to write and work on music together even from different provinces using the internet. They are currently halfway done writing and recording their third album which is set to be out in the fall. Not bad for a couple of kids from Fort Nelson.

Give It Up:

Give up your meals for a day, lunch for a week, or a staple food item. Walk in the shoes of hunger to begin to understand what it means to go without food, experiencing the effects of hunger first hand.

Cash store fails to comply with ruling from Consumer Protection BC

VICTORIA - Consumer Protection BC has filed a Notice of Penalty and Compliance Order with The Supreme Court of British Columbia after Cash Store Financial Inc., a Canadian payday lender more commonly known as The Cash Store or Instalogs, failed to meet requirements laid out in their March 23rd, 2012 compliance order and notice of administrative penalty.

Cash Store Financial was ordered to immediately comply with BC payday lending laws and was given 30 days to pay a \$25,000 administrative penalty as well as costs incurred by Consumer Protection BC. Cash Store Financial has failed to comply with this order.

"Cash Store's failure to take action has led us to take the next steps to ensure consumers are protected when using payday lenders," said Manjit Bains, vice president of corporate relations, Consumer Protection BC.

Consumer Protection BC has added 10 per cent in late penalty fees to the \$25,000

administrative penalty owed by Cash Store Financial bringing the total to \$27,500. Cash Store Financial has also been directed to maintain all documentation related to loans subject to the original compliance order.

Cash Store was also ordered to begin refunding consumers who had been overcharged since November 1st, 2009 and they have been given until June 21st, 2012 to meet this requirement. The total amount to be refunded is not yet known, but may be in the millions of dollars.

"Consumers who have been overcharged must be reimbursed immediately by Cash Store Financial," said Bains.

In response to consumer concerns, an online refund tracking form has been set up on Consumer Protection BC's website for customers of The Cash Store and Instalogs who think they are eligible for a refund.

"We are encouraging any consumer who received loans from The Cash Store or Instalogs with a cash card to contact

Consumer Protection BC and register on our website," said Bains. "Our job is to ensure consumers know their rights and are able to seek a refund if they have been overcharged."

An investigation launched in 2010 by Consumer Protection BC concluded that Cash Store Financial was charging customers more than the maximum legal amount of \$23 per \$100 on payday loans by charging additional fees to issue loans on cash cards. The payday lender was issued a Compliance Order in November 2010 to stop charging the unlawful fees and refund customers. Cash Store Financial requested a reconsideration of the decision which was completed in March 2012; the key elements of the original decision were upheld.

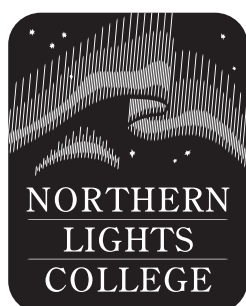
